But viewing the challenges of 21st century our Management and authority permitted us to setup digital language lab with an increased capacity of 21 students. After a lot of home work we could set up the lab in 2007 stated it officially in January 2008.

It helps to maintain constant two way communication with every student independently after precise guidance during session. ORAL TESTING :- Oral test features allow instructors to test students with a question or stimulus and only record the student's

answer. The instructor can stop the student recording when the next question is to be played or spoken to the student.

TEACHER MONITERING :- Since the teacher is not constricting on producing the next question or drill, he/she can concentrate more on the student responses.
