In addition to this, from this academic year we have started, three years full-time B.Sc. (Biotechnology) course. We have also started Certificate Course in Information Technology (approved by the Govt. of Maharashtra) for college as well as outside students. We have also introduced Music as one of the optional subjects at B.A. Level.

Teachers from the Department of Biotechnology attended curriculum design workshop for B.Sc. First year course at College of Computer Science and Information Technology, Sponsored by Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded.

Dr. V.S.Shembekar is acting as the University's Curriculum Design Coordinator for Biotechnology course.

Information Technology Department organised workshop for Departmental teachers on HTML : Form Designing and ASP.

Seminar for each paper at P.G. level is made compulsory by the Geography Department.

Seminars are made compulsory for students at B.Sc. Third year (Microbiology) using teaching aids.

**27. Technology upgradation :**

We have upgraded computers purchased earlier. On-line Examination software is developed for competitive exams. Office automation software is upgraded. Mechanical balances have been replaced with automatic electronic balances in the Chemistry Department.

**36. Activities of the Guidance and Counseling Unit :**

Ours is not a professional college. However, we display advertisements and some of the teachers assist and guide students in securing employment.

**37. Placement services provided to students :**

We are thinking of establishing placement service cell in the college.

**38. Development programmes for non-teaching staff :**

Computer bar code application training is given to the library staff. Office staff is also given computer literacy training. Both these trainings are given free of charge.

**39. Healthy practices of the Institution :**

‘Pursuit of Excellence’ is the motto of our institution. The college regularly follows the University prescribed curricula and this is reflected in the excellent results produced by this college year after year. The college not only looks after the academic excellence, but also sees to it that the students achieve all-round development. The students excel in various debate, cultural and sports events. Several of the staff members are social workers who motivate the students to take part in socially useful activities like tree plantation, blood donation, anti AIDS drive, development of scientific attitude. The students and the staff also actively work for the eradication of superstition.

**NSS Unit**

There are 250 volunteers (Including 65 girls) in our NSS unit. They are working under the guidance of five teaching staff members.

Following programmes were arranged by the unit.

- i. ‘Water is life’ This was the theme and on this topic Dr. Datta Deshkar from Aurangabad guided our volunteers regarding the importance of saving water and its resources.
- ii. Nirdhar Din, Kranti Din, Mukti Sangram Din, Republic Day, Independence Day and NSS Day were celebrated.
- iii. **Following rallies were organised :** Anti-tobacco, Anti-AIDS and Ashwamedha rally were organised.
- iv. **Workshops and Camps organised :** Personality Development workshop was organized in which volunteers were given guidance on Sex Education. Pre-Republic Day Preparatory camp, Blood Donation Camp, Special Youth Camp were organised. To make students aware of environment and its problems Nature Club is established. Traffic safety week, Vivekanand Jayanti were part of the Youth Festival week.
- v. Suvarna Shelke is awarded the Best NSS volunteer. This is a State Level Award.

- vi. Well-known Social worker Shri Anna Hajare visited and had discussion with our volunteers.

### **Students Association**

Various student associations such as, Science Association, Commerce Association, Social Sciences Association and Individual departmental associations such as Geography, English, Physics and Electronics, Biology and Microbiology are formed and they maintain record of alumni, they run a wall magazine, blood group testing, career guidance clippings, etc. are displayed. They also conduct debate and sports activities.

### **Andha Shraddha Nirmulan**

Our college organized State Level Conference for Primary School Teachers and District Level Conference for Middle School Teachers to inculcate scientific awareness among them. District unit of 'Maharashtra Andhasharadda Nimulan Samiti' with its centre at our college campaigned against the fake miracles of 'Narendra Maharaj' who is popular amongst the rural folk of the state. Similarly the unit works against the 'animal sacrifice' during local festival at Bhise Wagholi, Dist. Latur. The 'Samiti' also works against Black Magic prevalent in nearly 20 villages and exposed the evil-doers.

### **NCC**

Our cadets are encouraged to actively participate in the NCC and appear for 'B' and 'C' certificates. 19 male cadets and 6 female cadets cleared 'B' certificate while 8 male cadets and 8 female cadets passed 'C' certificate examination this year. Female cadets were given training in First Aid, Map Reading, Traffic Signals, Weaponry, Warfare and Yoga. This type of training inculcates discipline, confidence, unity, bravery, leadership, cooperation and social awareness among the cadets. Our cadets took part in para-sailing, WALMI (Water and Land Management Institute), Group Selection Camp, Pre-RD camp, Annual Training Camp, Army Selection Camp, National Level Mountaineering camp and Advanced Leadership camp.

### **Office**

Office administration is computerized i.e. admissions, examinations, eligibility of students, recruitment, salary and accounts is computerised.

### **Seminars Organised**

In this academic year National Seminar on Thin Films was organised by the Department of Physics and Electronics in October, 2004. A State Level Seminar on Modern Trends in Library and Information Science was organised by the Department of Library and Information Science in September, 2004.

### **Languages**

SAFE (Students' Association of Functional English) organized educational tours to SOS Balgram, Printing Press (News paper) and to rural sector Lijjat Papad Mahila Udyog. SAFE organized Group wise survey for first year students, individual survey for second and third year students regarding their projects. The department of English has established Language Lab and a Study Circle for students. Teachers organize group discussion and debating competitions. Since most of our students come from vernacular medium, to improve their spoken, reading, writing and listening skills, special classes with audio-visual aids, are conducted. The Department of Pali organised educational tours to Buddhist sites. The Department of Sanskrit conducts Sanskrit Conversation classes for all those interested in spoken Sanskrit.

**Science Faculty :** The Department of Zoology and Fisheries conducted Remedial classes for the weaker students and implemented a scheme under which prizes were given to meritorious students. The Department of Chemistry and Analytical Chemistry undertakes water, soil and industrial material testing. Department of Physics and Electronics conducted water table survey for farmers. Department of Microbiology conducts microbiological analysis of water for schools, provides guidance for DMLT related techniques.

- i. The Department of Physics and Electronics has linkage with Shivaji University, Kolhapur and Inter Universities Centre for Astronomy and Astrophysics (IUCAA), Pune.

- iii. The Department of Microbiology has linkage with the nationally reputed Institute of Science, Aurangabad and School of Life Sciences, North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon.
- iv. The Department of Sanskrit has linkage with Bhandarkar Oriental Research Institute, Pune.

**41. Any other relevant information the institution wishes to add :**

- Internet facility is available to everyone through PSTN and ISDN in our library.
- Even though library hours are from 10.00 a.m. to 5.45 p.m., we keep our reading rooms open from 08.30 a.m. to 11.30 p.m.
- From this academic year we have started University approved six months Certificate Course in Health and Yoga. Ours is the only college which has started this value-addition course.
- Our teachers have published research papers and authored text books. These include teachers from the Departments of Marathi, Sociology, Geography, Microbiology, Physics and Electronics, Sanskrit, Hindi and History.
- Our Department of Marathi Collected very rare books and manuscripts. This is a valuable asset to researchers.
- Department of Geography donated Rs. 1,000/- to Tsunami Relief Fund. The teachers also framed M.Phil. syllabus in Geography.
