Part – A : The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement and the outcome achieved by the end of the year :

Ours is NAAC accredited 'A' grade college with an institutional score of 88.25%, so in the Quality Advisory Committee of IQAC meeting it was decided that the college should try to introduce innovative programmes and try for UGC-CPE status.

QAC of IQAC also suggested to explore the possibility of getting funds for laboratory equipment through various funding agencies UGC, DST and DBT. The committee also suggested that as part of quality improvement, the college should chalk out plan of action for (i) Developing college web site through professionals (ii) Computerize science departments by providing computers (iii) Organize seminars (iv) Organize seminars by students for final year UG and PG courses. (v) Start MS-CIT course for students for computer literacy (vi) Generate internal resources.

We are glad to note that in September 2006, UGC has granted us CPE status and sanctioned us Rs. 60 Lakhs out of which it released 50% amount immediately (Refer Annexure-01). UGC has also sanctioned us Rs. 40,50,000/- for photonics course under its innovative programme scheme. UGC also sanctioned us NRC grant of Rs. 1,70,000/- and Rs. 3,71,000/- for IMF.

We could computerize Science Departments as we have provided computer to every science department. Our final year UG students and PG students are conducting seminars as part of their regular academic activity.

Our Department of Geography has submitted a proposal to UGC for organising a seminar on Global Warming. We could send three of our teachers for doing research under UGC's FIP under Xth plan period.

We have started MS-CIT course for college employees, students and outsiders.

Our computer science and IT-department has developed college website.

We have received Rajiv Gandhi National Fellowship grant worth Rs.2,00,000/- from UGC in this academic year.

The internal resources generated during this academic year by the college through donations is Rs. 2, 95,546/-.

Part – B

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution :

Pursuit of Excellence is the mission of our institution. Keeping in mind this mission, we strictly adhere to transparency in financial matters and in the conduct of examinations. The teachers should concentrate on their teaching in the college, so there is a complete ban on private tuition for our teachers.

Staff members are selected only and only on merit basis. To make students and society aware of social problems we regularly arrange Shahu Lecture Series on important subjects, eminent scientists, social reformers, politicians, academicians expressed their views through this lecture series.

In order to help students coming from rural and economically backward strata, we have introduced “Principal A.S.Jadhav Earn and Learn Scheme”. 58 students took benefit of this scheme.

Students assessment of teachers is done regularly. To promote research activity, research centers are established in five subjects.

We have special cell for promoting students’ entry into services. We have established it in collaboration with an NGO, ‘Flight Cadet Prasad Shendge Memorial Trust’ under which lectures of Army Personnel are arranged regularly. In addition to this, every year a one week personality Development Programme is also organised.

To promote value education we have established “Anti-addiction Drive” cell which is very active. To inculcate scientific attitude and to oppose blind beliefs / superstitions prevalent in the society, we run a unit of ‘Vivek Vahini’ under

‘Maharashtra Andha Shraddha Nirmulan Samiti’. We also run Health and Yoga courses.

We run coaching classes for various competitive examinations under “Shahu Prabodhini”.

As part of community services, we organise through our NSS and NCC units Vivek Vahini, Andhshrada Nirmulan Samiti and students associations various socially useful activities such as blood donation, tree plantation, rural cleanliness drive, health and hygiene in rural areas, environmental awareness drive etc.

For the students from economically weaker sections of the society, fee concessions are given at the time of admissions.

A set of special study material package from our library is given to meritorious students.

An employees welfare fund is in operation for the welfare of employees.

Through our Rajarshi Shahu College employees co-operative credit society various loan schemes and other concessional purchase schemes are implemented. We also have Employees Grievance and Redressal Cell.

2. New academic Programmes initiated (UG and PG) :

We have introduced M.Phil in 10 subjects in collaboration with Yeshwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University (YCMOU). The subjects are : Marathi, Hindi, English, Sociology, Political Science, History, Economics, Commerce, Library Science and Public Administration.

3. Innovations in Curricular design and Transaction :

The seminars by students are organised in the Department of Political science, Public administration, Economics, History, Sociology, Geography, English, Zoology and Fishery science, Botany, Sanskrit, Mathematics, Microbiology, Chemistry and Analytical chemistry and Commerce.

In the Commerce, Geography, History, Economics, Library & Information science Departments, the project works were assigned to UG and PG students and projects were evaluated by external examiners.

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The departments of Geography, History, Botany, Economics, English, Microbiology, Chemistry and Analytical Chemistry have organised study tours based on their syllabus concepts in Deepawali Vacations to avoid the disturbance in regular academic schedule.

The students of History, as a part of skill development displayed wall magazine regularly. The department of Sanskrit has conducted a 10 day “Sanskrit Conversation Classes” for BA students as a part of improvement of grammar skills among students.

The department of Marathi has conducted a training programme for students of BA to improve their reading and writing skills.

Twenty four (24) students completed their projects in English literature. The students of BA under Department of English have conducted a survey on computer education by visiting various computer centers in the city.

We have separate Language Laboratory facility, the students make use of the programme for improving their language skills. The laboratory is also used for practical purposes. The Department of English has conducted seminars by students on various burning issues like terrorism, dowry system, discipline, appreciation of poem, Indian festivals, etc.

The Department of English has conducted various student centered activities like guest lectures, use of dictionary, speech, word puzzles, passage reading, singing, jokes, mimicry, dance and English conversation.

Internal marks for BCA and B.Sc. (Comp.Sci.) courses are given on the basis of certain criteria such as marks obtained in pre-semester exam, unit tests, semester examination and attendance.

A one week programme of training is given for students of commerce, arts, and science faculties under personality development programme sponsored by “Flight Cadet Prasad Shendge Memorial Trust.”

The Department of Geography has organised seminars for students of MA and M.Phil. courses. The department has also undertaken training programme for students exhibiting project models in the festival “Avishkar”, a university level Science Research Festival.

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PG students of Biotechnology completed five research projects at National Chemical Laboratory / (NCL) Pune, Vasantdada Sugar Institute (VSI) Pune, Ajit Seeds, Disha INS, Nagpur and University of Pune's Biotechnology Department. 14 students of M.Sc. (Biotech) visited Pharma Company at Bidar in Karnataka and B.Sc. (Biotech) students visited PTC lab of MGM College, Nanded. Twenty students of M.Sc. (Biotech) have successfully undergone training programme held at Madurai Kamraj University, JIWAS Institute, Bangalore, VSI Pune, NARI Pune, Bharat Serum Pune and UNISANKYO, Hyderabad.

All the students of B.Sc. (Biotech) have successfully completed training programme at Disha INS Nagpur, MITCON Pune and Deogiri College, Aurangabad.

Three of the faculty members of Biotech Department have completed training programme on the HPTLC technique at ANCHROM, Mulund, Mumbai.

Thirteen students of B.Sc. (Biotech) participated in the exhibition based on integrated pest management, vermi wash, bio-diesel and use of *Azardicta Indica* as a medicinal plant held at Kavtha in Osmanabad District, Maharashtra. Twenty (20) students of B.Sc. (Biotech) also participated in the exhibition held at our college. Two of our B.Sc.(Biotech) students have represented college at University level research exhibition "Avishkar". Forty six (46) PG (Biotech) students attended various National / State Level Conferences / Workshops held at Osmanabad, Parbhani, Aurangabad and Barshi.

Thirty one (31) UG (Biotech) students attended National / State Level Conference and seminar held at our college.

Dr.C.S.Mali, HOD, Physics and Electronics worked as Resource Person in a workshop on syllabus framing held at Nutan Mahavidyalaya, Selu, Dist. Parbhani.

PG students of Photonics have bagged first prize in a state level competition in science exhibition held at Balbhim College, Beed. B.Sc. T.Y. students of Physics and Electronics, as a part of their syllabus, have submitted a project report. Out of two practical papers at B.Sc. T.Y. (Physics and Electronics), the

project work on elective paper is conducted. B.Sc. T.Y. students of Physics and Electronics presented a project entitled “Prediction of earthquake” at Avishkar Research Festival held at Yashwant College, Nanded.

Every year 10-day Sanskrit Conversation course is run in collaboration with Sanskrit Prachar Bharti.

UG and PG student of Library and Information Science, as part of skill development, took part in the following programmes :

- i. How to retrieve bibliographic data from OPAC?
- ii. How to search information on the internet using various search engines?
- iii. Elocution / Reading and Writing competition
- iv. Encourage students to evaluate reference books
- v. Encourage students to appear for various competitive examinations.
- vi. Interaction with various library units during study tour programmes.

Students of Library and information science participated in exhibition wherein their project works were displayed.

5. Examination reforms implemented :

Term tests for each term and pre-annual examination in the month of February for non-semester courses, and pre-semester exams for semester courses are conducted as per the university pattern. Absentee students are penalised and the meritorious students are rewarded with cash prizes. The assessed answer books of these tests / exams are given to the students as a corrective measure. The performance of students in the tests and pre-annual exam are communicated to parents. On the basis of previous year result analysis, the students with better future career are identified in each subject and given special attention towards their progress throughout the academic year. Transparency in conduct of exams is strictly maintained.

A record of individual students about their attendance, performance in regular practicals is maintained as a guide for evaluation of students at the annual practical exams.

Two of our staff members Miss. P.G. Kavle and Mr. V.J. Dalvi have passed NET examination. One student of geography department has passed SET-examination. One teacher of Department of English has passed SET examination. Three of our teachers in the Department of Public Administration have passed SET Examination.

Four students of Economics Department have passed NET-Examination and one student has passed SET Examination. Five former students of Library and Information Science have cleared SET examination.

18. Community Services :

Prof. O.N.Madansure is involved in various socially useful activities such as Blood donation, Water conservation drive, Service to physically handicapped, Small Saving Scheme Programme, Gram Swachchata Abhiyan, Scientific Awareness Programme and Antisuperstition Drive. He has organised workshops / awareness programmes in 58 different villages on antisuperstition and witchcraft. Prof.O.N.Madansure has solved problems related to family conflicts, Bhanamati and Mahila Sabalakaran prevailing in 8 villages in Marathwada Region.

He is also involved in promotion of Small Saving Scheme for women and has helped women in 16 villages surrounding Latur under the scheme.

He is also actively involved in personality development programme for blind and physically handicapped organised at village Budhoda by “Gramin Shramik Pratishthan” Budhoda, Dist Latur.

Our college office has been computerised and the issue of fee receipts, scholarships etc., to students are processed by computerised mechanism through PRN.

26. Increase in the infrastructural facilities :

- The commerce department has purchased an additional 10 computers, 22 chairs, 8 tables and 04 wooden cupboards.
- The department of computer science and IT has purchased a laser printer.
- Computer internet facility is made available to all the students including students of computer science and IT at the E-learning centre of our college.
- BOD incubator is purchased by Dept. of Biotechnology.
- Two soxhlet extraction apparatus units are purchased by Dept. of Botany.
- Department of Microbiology has purchased (i) Digital photoelectric colorimeter (ii) Heating Mantle (iii) Dryer
- Dept. of Chemistry and Analytical Chemistry has purchased (i) Digital single pan balance pH meter (ii) Photoelectric colorimeter (iv) conductometer.
- Dept. of Physics and Electronics has established a separate laboratory for Astrophysics, Energy studies, Soil physics and Atmospheric physics. The department has purchased power supply units (30), Research optical bench (1), Diode laser (1), Green laser with power supply (1), Laser light and diffraction

grating (1), Brewsters angle laser (1) and furniture is provided to astrophysics lab.

- Virtual learning centre is established in collaboration with Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University (YCMOU) and ISRO unit at Ahmedabad.
- Department of Library and Information Science purchased three computers, one printer, one pen drive, 100 chairs, one computer table and three office chairs.
- A separate block of building for gymnasium hall, table tennis, chess and other sports activities has been constructed during 2006-07.

27. Technology upgradation :

The commerce computer lab with 10 computers has been established and is provided with broadband internet facility. The broadband internet facility is made available to B.Lib./M.Lib. students with 10 terminals. Under virtual learning centre (VLC) interaction between students and subject experts through edu-sat in collaboration with YCMOU and ISRO has been brought about.

Department of computer science and IT laboratory is upgraded with laser printer.

The library and information science unit has enhanced its facilities by purchasing two CCTV – colour zoom cameras. E-learning centre with 20 computers and broadband internet has been setup under UGC-CPE scheme.

The computers at various departments are equipped with upgraded softwares. Under the networking of computers of UGC-CPE scheme, we have provided 20 computers.

28. Computer and internet access and training to teachers and students :

The computer access facility is made available to teachers of Physics and Electronics, Computer Science and IT, Chemistry and Analytical Chemistry, Zoology and Fishery Science, Microbiology, Botany, Library and Information Science and Commerce. Computer and internet access facility has been

provided to both students and teachers at our Commerce Lab, E-learning Centre and Computer Science and IT Departments.

Our E-learning centre runs MS-CIT certificate cum training course organised by Govt. of Maharashtra on usage of computers and internet accessibility for students, teachers and non-teaching staff. Daily on an average 100 students took benefit of this scheme. This centre is recognised by Maharashtra Knowledge Corporation Limited (MKCL).

29. Financial aid to students :

Fee concessions are given to students from economically weaker sections during the admissions.

Students from landless, economically weaker and labour-class families are identified and such students are included in our unique “Principal A.S.Jadhav Earn and Learn Scheme”. These students earn through remunerative work in the college premises to meet their educational expenditure. 58 students took benefit of this scheme. Central and state government scholarship are given to meritorious students. The best performers in term tests and pre-annual examinations are rewarded with cash prizes. Some of our staff members and local philanthropists adopt students with economically poor background and meet their educational expenditure.

30. Activities and support from the Alumni Association :

All the pass-out UG and PG students are compulsorily made the members of alumni association. They extend their helping hands in generating internal resources and also contribute for the extension work of construction of our college / hostel building.

31. Activities and support from the Parent-Teacher Association :

The relevant issues are discussed with parents in a common meeting organised in the beginning of academic year / at least once in the academic year.

Parents are informed regularly about the progress of their wards. The parents are invited to attend the meeting with Principal wherever there is a difficulty associated with the performance and other issues.

32. Health Services :

Some of our management members are medical practitioners who provide medical services to our teaching / non-teaching staff members in needy hours.

In the event of minor health problems / laboratory accidental cases, we resort first to first aid kits kept at various departments and then seek help from clinics in the neighbourhood of our college run by our former students.

36. Activities of the Guidance and Counselling Unit :

- The commerce department conducts Guidance and Counselling Programme for CA-CPA and MBA entrance examinations.
- Department of Russian is involved in the career guidance and counselling to UG students
- Department of Economics conducts guidance and counselling for UG / PG students regularly.
- Oral guidance and counselling to students is also provided by the department of Marathi.
- Department of Biotechnology provides guidance and counselling for M.Sc. final year students not only for job but also for NET examination.
- Guidance and Counselling to B.Sc.Final year students of Chemistry and Analytical Chemistry, Botany and Microbiology is given for PG Entrance Examination.
- Newspaper advertisements for vacancies are regularly displayed by Department of Microbiology.
- Dept. of Maths has given guidance and counselling regarding job opportunities to UG students.
- Students of Library and information science are given guidance and counselling for placements using VLC.

- Department of public administration arranged guest lectures on career guidance.

37. Placement services provided to students :

The Department of commerce has a unit of placement cell under which advertisements relating to vacancies are displayed on notice board and the unit remains always in touch with local banks like ICICI and IDBI for interaction with prospective students for recruitments.

The Department of Biotechnology helped its PG students in exploring and securing job opportunities and contacted Cadila, Galxo and Ranbaxy Pharmaceutical Companies. Seven students have benefited and got jobs.

38. Development programmes for non-teaching staff :

The computer literacy training programme through a subsidized MS-CIT Course organised by Govt. of Maharashtra is implemented for our non teaching staff at our E-learning centre.

An employees welfare fund is in operation, the benefit of which is taken by our non-teaching staff members.

“Health and Yogasan / Pranayam” classes were organised for non-teaching staff.

39. Healthy practices of the Institution :

As a part of academic planning and execution, we undertake the following academic and administrative measures :

- An annual Teaching Plan is prepared in the beginning of the academic year by each teacher and recorded in the individual teacher’s diary and the same is given to the students in the beginning of academic year. The progress of the teaching as per plan is verified by the vice-principal / principal and corrective measures are taken.
- Daily teaching report is maintained by each teacher classwise and paperwise and is verified at the end of every month by the vice-principal / principal.

Monthwise, the number of periods available for each paper are calculated in the beginning of the year for each paper by the teacher and the progress of the same is verified by the concerned authority at the end of each month.

- A separate Academic Calender is prepared for each academic year which contains term wise schedule plan of various academic, educational activities such as registration and finalization of admissions, tentative date of beginning of regular classes, formation of students council, inauguration of students council, Educational awareness week, Deepawali vacations, completion of syllabus, Annual social gathering, pre-annual exam schedule, send off, summer vacation, re-opening day of next academic year.

All the activities are executed as per the pre-decided schedule.

Alongwith this, the particulars of term-vacations and holidays are given in the beginning of the academic year.

- The daily attendance of students is taken and at the end of each month a paperwise absentee report (i.e. attendance below 75%) is prepared by each teacher and submitted to the office. On the basis of this, the monthly attendance report is sent to the parents and corrective measures are taken.
- A unit test is conducted for each term / pre-semester both for UG and PG classes as per the university exam pattern and absent students are penalized. The performance of students communicated to parents. For PG-classes tutorials are prepared.
- The pre-annual examination is conducted in the month of February 2007 as per the annual university exam pattern and the meritorious students are rewarded with cash prizes failure students are penalized and the assessed answer books are given to all the students. The unit test, pre-annual exam and annual exam result analysis is undertaken and corrective measures taken and concerned teachers are made aware of. For each faculty we have a co-ordination committee which looks after the planning and execution of various academic activities. In the beginning of academic year a meeting of co-ordination committee was arranged on 27.07.2006 in which previous academic year

results analysis, finalization of subject groups on 05.05.2007 programme of the unit test, etc. were discussed.

- A paperwise feedback programme of assessment of teaching of all teachers by the students through the faculty coordinator and principal are undertaken termwise and corrective measures are taken from time to time.
- At the end of each academic year, the assessment of teachers by students is undertaken through a prescribed proforma.
- Teacher assessment of principal is also taken at the end of academic year.
- The parents are asked to attend the meeting with principal whenever there is difficulty with regard to poor performance, poor attendance, problems of students and their difficulties sorted out therein.
- A suggestion box common to all students is placed in the campus and valuable suggestions are addressed properly for once in a term.
- An open debate platform is made available for the students to discuss their day to day problems with principal and teaching staff.
- The student volunteers of commerce association organised a blood donation scheme under which 50 students donated blood to blood bank and in turn received donation cards which were used later for the needy, patients. (Refer Annexure 04)
- The Department of English conducts departmental staff meetings regularly to discuss workload distribution, language lab programmes, setting up of departmental library, remedial classes for students on Sundays, students association activates, special guidance to slow learners, question paper pattern, student attendance, use of audio visual aids in teaching-learning process, unit tests, position of syllabus and its completion.
- The department of computer science and IT runs a unique scheme where in the faculty member meet daily at specified period for 15 minutes between 10.15 to 10.30 am to maintain the co-ordination and harmony in the department.

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- The students of BCA, B.Sc. Comp.Sci. and M.Sc.Comp. and staff members of computer science and IT-voluntarily donated the blood to the needy in the blood donation camp.
- The students of various departments have formed their own students associations. They also run wall magazine for infotainment. These associations are : (i) commerce students association, (ii) students association of geography (Geography study circle) (iii) History study circle, (iv) Political science students association (v) Hindi study circle, (vi) Student association of Economics, (vii) Students association of Marathi Bhasha and Sahitya Association. (viii) Students association of functional English and English (ix) Students association of Biology (SAB) (x) Microbiology Students Association (Microbiol) (xi) Students Association of Physics and Electronics (xii) Library and Information Science Students Association. (xiii) Public Administration Students Association.
- These students associations undertake various student centered activities throughout the year such as inauguration, poster presentation, competitive events, quiz tests, guest lectures, map reading, surveys, tree plantation, blood test, blood donation, send off programmes, etc.
- Each faculty students celebrate their won faculty day namely Arts faculty day, Commerce faculty day and Science faculty day generally one day prior to Annual Gathering Day.
- This year Hindi Day was celebrated on 14th September in the presence of Dr.Iresh Swami, VC of Solapur University. Every year this day is celebrated by organising various competitions such as essay writing, debate, recitation of poetry, writing of poems etc.. Department of Hindi also guides female students to become self-reliant.
- Students of Microbiology have organised blood group checking camp on the occasion of independence day in 2006.
- “Principal A.S.Jadhav Earn and Learn” is a unique scheme of our college. 58 students are taking benefit of this scheme. The same students live in our Boys’

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Hostel on nominal rent. There are three office-bearers in this Hostel to look after the administration as well as difficulties of the students.

- In our Ladies Hostel, we accommodate 120 girls in 57 rooms. Here the admission is strictly on merit basis for outstation girls. All the facilities such as mess, water softener, generator, telephone, solar heater, etc. are provided. Nine office-bearers look after them.
- Indoor and outdoor games facility is available.
- Our college is an active member of “Maharashtra Andha Shraddha Nirmulan Samiti” which works for the eradication of superstition under which we run “Vivek Vahini” to develop scientific attitude among students. In addition to this “Sane Guruji Bal Sanskar Kendra” is also run by Vivek Vahini.
- Two of our students run this centre for slum dwellers of Coil Nagar, Latur.

NCC Girls and Boys Unit :

This unit arranges training programmes for the cadets in the subjects such as posture training, self-defence, communication, first aid, leadership, environment protection, NCC administration, obstacle management, field engineering, civil defence, battle tactics. These trainings include classroom training, ground training, camp training. Duration of the training is three years. 53 cadets took benefit of this programme 27 cadets passed B and 9 cadets passed C certificate examination.

Our cadets participate in various training camps such as annual training camp, para military medical attachment camp, para sailing camp, mountaineering camp, cycle expedition, scuba diving camp, thal sena camp, CATC, Pre-RD and RD camps.

NSS Unit :

Our NSS unit has organised August 9 Kranti Din, Community Services on Independence Day, Forest Tour, 27th August Sadbhavan Din, 10th September College Campus Cleanliness Day, 18 to 25 September as social awareness and awakening week. December 1 as anti-AIDS drive day. We have also organised guidance programme by renowned persons from Rotary Club on Republic Day.

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Six of our NSS volunteers participated in District Level Youth Camp. Nine NSS volunteers, including four girls, participated in Padmashri Baba Amte's Camp in Anandvan. 39 volunteers participated in 'Chikun Gunya' controlling programme under the sponsorship of Municipal Council and Civil Hospital, Latur.

- Marathwada Liberation Day was celebrated by organising poetry recitation, essay, rangoli, painting competition. October 2 was observed as anti-addiction and cleanliness day.
- In the blood donation camp on 10th October, 62 volunteers donated blood at Bhalchandra Blood Bank, Latur.
- A special residential Youth Camp was organised during 26.10.2006 to 04.11.2006 at Lodga in which three programme officers, 3 peons and 125 volunteers took part. During this period 108 toilet pits were dug, animal disease diagnosis camp was also organised, promotion of "Mahila Bachat Gat" and health knowledge rally, village cultural programme and information about snakes was given to villagers.
- Savitribai Phule Birth Anniversary was organized. In it, all the girls took part. Birth Anniversary of Swami Vivekanand and Youth week (12 to 19 January) was jointly celebrated and prizes were given to winners.

Sports :

126 sportsmen participated in various level competitions such as university level, inter university level competitions. Out of these 126 participants, 52 sportsmen bagged first prize, 21 sportsmen bagged second prize in various events.

Library :

Our library organises book exhibition on Dr.R.Ranganathan birth anniversary i.e. on 12th August and death anniversary on 27th September every year. Library has well equipped computer lab with multi-media facility which is made available in the staff reading room. The unit has vast collection of study material for various competitive examinations such as IIT-JEE, MHT-CET, MBA-CAT, NDA, NET-SET, GRE, GMAT, CAT, TOEFL, UPSC/MPSC, CA

foundation courses. The library has 76277 books,, 2681 bound vlumes, 146 subscribed periodicals / journals, 20 newspapers, 1305 non-book material with main server, 30 nodes for 4794 students and 273 staff members. The library provides following services :

- i. Circulation of study material
- ii. Reference books / journals
- iii. Photo-copying facilities
- iv. Selective dissemination of informaiton
- v. CAS / Information display and notification
- vi. Newspaper clippings
- vii. Online internet / digital resources availability.
- viii. Bibliographic compilation

On and average 950 books / journals are circulated every day through our library. Reading room and night library facility is made available from 8.30 am to 11.30 pm during June to December and 8.30 to midnight from January to May including holidays.

E-learning Centre :

- i. From this year the college has started E-learning centre under UGC-CPE scheme (from February 2007). Now we have provided 20 computers with broadband connection. The number of computers will soon be increased. On an average daily 100 students took benefit of this scheme.

- Department of Biotechnology has developed linkages / MOU with Department of Biophysics, Govt. Institute of Science, Aurangabad and Department of Biophysics, University of Mumbai.
- Department of Microbiology has linkage with Dayanand Science College, Latur for guidance to research scholars pursuing Ph.D. and other inter-departmental collaboration.

- Department of computer science and IT has developed a software for internal examination.
- Dr.M.H.Gavane has written a textbook of Pol.Science for Junior College students.
- Prof.S.N.Shinde has written two text books of Biology for Junior college students.
- Dr.S.J.Phule has written text books of Geography for Junior College students.
- Prof.S.S.Bhandawalkar has written two text books :

Part – C : Details of the plans of the institution for the next year :

In the Quality Advisory committee of IQAC meeting held on 20.04.2007, it was decided to implement UGC-CPE scheme giving priority to E-learning, networking of departments using Wi-Fi technology and establishment of language laboratory.
